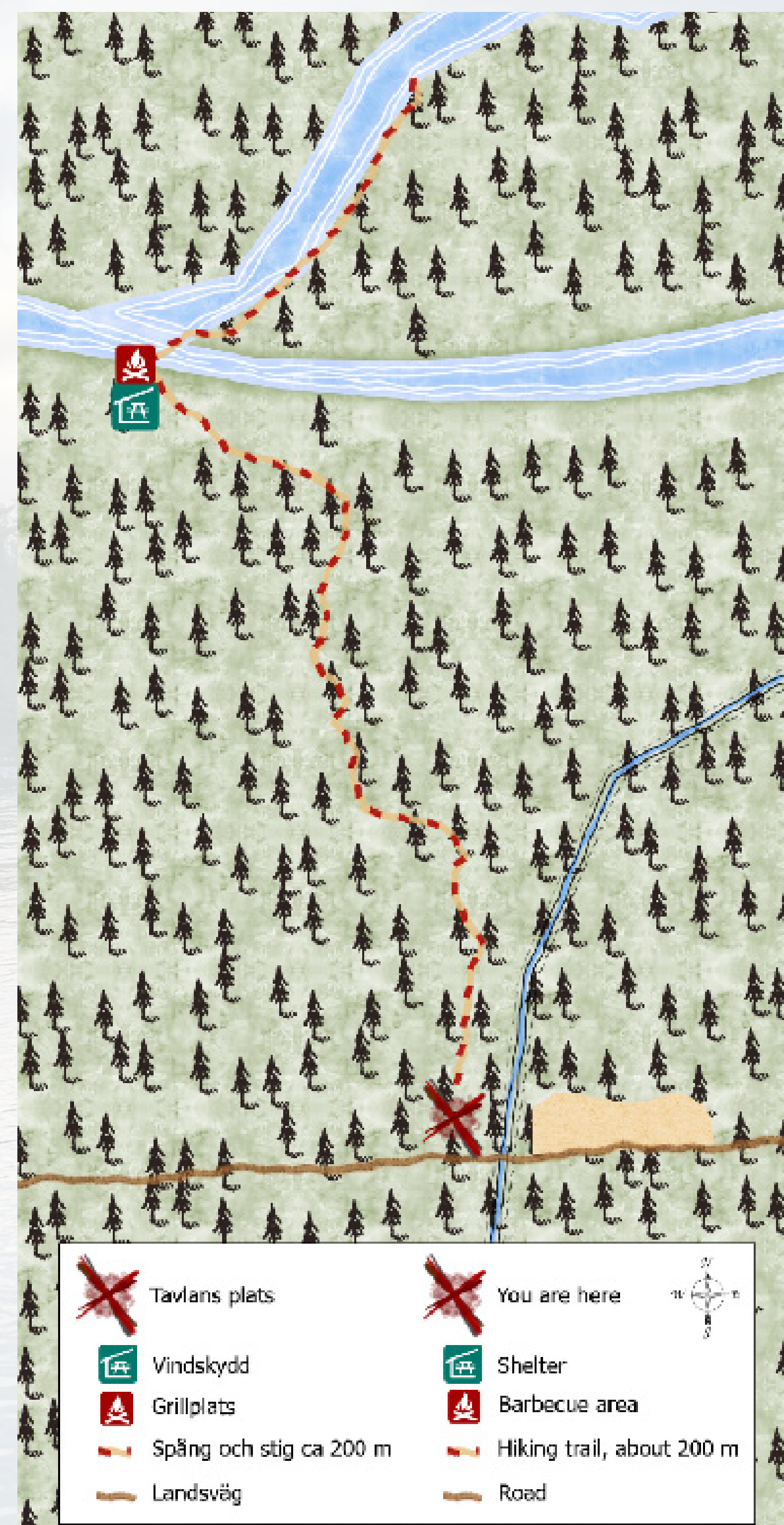
Welcome to Agnelån's demonstration area for stream habitat restoration

Our waterways

Agnelån, like many of our waterways in northern Sweden, has been used to float timber. Now that we use trucks and trains to transport timber, we no longer need to use our rivers and streams. Therefore, we need to ensure that the streams and rivers are restored to how they once looked and functioned.

Follow the path that starts here at the sign. Eventually you will arrive at Agnelån. There, measures have been taken to restore the watercourse after the floating.

Along the path you will find information about timber floating, watercourse restoration and some of the animal and plant species that live here.



This is what Agnelån looks like after the restoration. If you go down to the river, you might see a blue dragonfly or a trout swimming in the water. Hopefully you'll learn something you didn't know about log rafting and watercourse restoration.



From June to August, the blue dragonfly (*Calopteryx virgo*) flies at Agnelån.
